Comments: **#5 Go With Gusto** (5-2) is a \$225k maiden for Mark Casse. She rallied from off the pace and crossed the line 1st in her 8T bow at WO, but she was placed 5th through disqualification. She rallied for the show in the G1 Summer Sept. 16 and runner-up My Boy Prince was a

next-out stakes winner in the Cup and Saucer. Rosario takes the call and she figures to make a run in the stretch. She got the best TRD Final Time Rating in the Summer. **#6 Mo Fox Givin** (6-1) stalked the pace and kicked away to win by 3 3/4 lengths in her turf route bow at Colonial Downs and was 49-1 that day. She rallied to miss by a head in a NW2L allowance turf route at CD second time out. Powell is her new trainer and Prat takes the call, and she will try to get involved from off the pace. She earned an improved speed rating second time out. **#4 Ultra Power** (3-1) chased wide and retreated to last in his disappointing dirt sprint bow Aug. 25. He was the favorite in an extended sprint at LRC second time out and he pressed inside and pulled clear, and the show finisher was a next-out winner. Dettori hops aboard the Curlin colt and he should impact the pace. Baffert is strong with his first route starters but is just 3% first turf (34-race sample). Unique Bella is the dam and she was a multiple G1 winner on dirt. **#8 Asean** (4-1) ran well in multiple 5T races on good ground in Ireland. She misfired twice including a 10th of 13 in a Group 3 in Great Britain Oct. 13, and both below par efforts were on soft ground. She should like the SoCal firm footing and has route influences on the dam side of her pedigree.

Comments: **#7 Grand Slam Smile** (5-2) drew a comfortable post and might be in the right stalking spot. She wired the field in her all-weather sprint bow, stalked and scored in the Fasig-Tipton Debutante second time out, and stalked and was clearly second best in the CTBA last time. The fresh Smiling Tiger filly drilled a 5f gate bullet for this at GG on Oct. 23. **#5 Mirinda** (8-5) was the even money favorite in her bow and she set the pace and kicked away to score by 6 1/2 lengths. The \$190k Mitole filly should be all over the pace but there was not much behind her in her DMR bow and she meets other speed in a tougher spot. Mike Smith stays put and Gary Mandella struggles with this type of short layoff runner. She is faster than these based on her debut speed rating. **#6 Prancingthruparis** (8-1) dueled and scored by a half-length in her 5T bow Aug. 11. She switched to dirt, stalked the pace, and was clearly second best in the Generous Portion second time out. She improved last time and will have to run faster to win this. Fresu stays put and he wins races with Eurton, and her stalking style should play well in this spot. **#11 Crazy Hot** (5-1) exits a wire-to-wire stakes victory in the Generous Portion under Smith, but he opted to ride Mirinda in this spot. She wired the field in her local bow and chased the pace and hit the board in back-to-back stakes races on June 17 and Aug. 6. She earned her best number yet last time and she drew outside the other speed. Johnny V is her new pilot.

SA 3 (Senator Ken Maddy, 6.5T hillside)

Comments: **#4 Elm Drive** (6-1) was pre-entered in the BC F&M Sprint but that race was too tough for her and she ends up here instead. She wired the field in the local Mizdirection May 20 and was able to get out there and control the pace that day. She also won the G3 Monrovia (off the turf) and placed in the G2 Great Lady M. and G1 Clement L. Hirsch. She was a fading 4th in the G3 Chillingworth Sept. 29 and might move forward under her new rider Prat in her second start after a short layoff. **#2 White Moonlight** (3-1) won a pair of extended sprints in Great Britain earlier this year. She was 7th of 13 in a Group 3 last time and Godolphin's mare owns the best class ratings in this field. **#12 Playlist** (4-1) stalked and smartly scored in back-to-back turf sprints at Ellis Park and Saratoga on June 15 and July 15. The Uncle Mo filly got a freshening after that and returned with a clear runner-up finish at this distance in a G2 at Kentucky Downs Sept. 9. Early-pressing types breaking from outside posts can be dangerous down the hill, but I would like her more if this race was shorter (both turf sprint wins at 5.5f). **#3 Honey Pants** (8-1) is a competent late running turf sprinter for D'Amato. She rallied for the place behind her stablemate Elm Drive in the G3 Mizdirection. **#13 Rose Maddox** (8-1) is a consistent CA-bred filly exiting a sharp local state bred stakes win at this course/distance. She will try to get involved from off the pace. **#6 Unbridled**

Mary (10-1) stalked, led, and weakened to 3rd late in the Swingtime at 8T Oct. 9. That race was a bit too far for her. The tactical mare is 2-for-3 with a runner-up finish at 6.5T.

Comments: **#10 Last Call London** (4-1) fired trifecta shots in 5 of 6 starts. He stalked and smartly graduated in a local 5f MSW sprint June 11, and lost all chance after stumbling at the start in his next stakes start at Pleasanton. He returned to SoCal and rallied to miss by a head in the Graduation Aug. 11, and he battled on the pace and was a close 3rd in the I'm Smokin Sept. 8. He ran well all five times Hernandez was aboard and this is his first start as a gelding. **#11 Magic Spoon** (6-1) had early trouble from the inside post and came running for the win in a nice local debut victory at 6f Oct. 7. This Good Magic colt earned a competitive speed rating in his bow and might be this good. **#1 Dr. No No** (7-2) stalked the pace from post 10 and finished a length behind Mici's Express in his bow. He stalked and aired as the favorite second time out, and stalked from the outside post and edged Mici's Express and Last Call London in the I'm Smokin last time. He will have to work out a different trip

from the inside post after breaking outside in his first three starts. **#12 Mici's Express** (5-1) was overmatched in the G3 Zuma Beach at 8T Oct. 8. He moved forward in his maiden win at DMR July 22, and was a close 3rd in the Graduation and missed by a nose in the I'm Smokin. Rosario hops aboard the late running threat. **#6 Private Gem** (8-1) rallied to score by a nose in his local CA-bred Mcl-50k bow at 5.5f under apprentice Torrealba Oct. 20. Mark Glatt claimed the Lookin At Lucky colt from Carla Gaines and Flavien Prat is his new pilot.

Trends: The chart below shows all five winners of the BC Juvenile Turf Sprint. Wesley Ward is the trainer to watch in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint. He won this race with Four Wheel Drive in 2019, Golden Pal in 2020, and filly Twilight Gleaming in 2021, and was second with filly Chelsea Cloisters in 2018. Irad Ortiz Jr. booted home all three of Ward's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint

winners. Overseas invader Mischief Magic (IRE) won the BC Juvenile Turf Sprint race in 2022 for Charles Appleby and Godolphin. Jockey William Buick guided him home, and he was exiting a fourth at Newmarket. Dramatised (IRE), a filly shipping from York, completed the exacta, and Private Creed finished third for trainer Steve Asmussen. Love Reigns (IRE) was the beaten favorite for Wesley Ward. The Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint was previously held at Santa Anita in 2019. The aforementioned Four Wheel Drive was the winner, and the son of American Pharoah was exiting a victory in the Futurity (G3) at Belmont Park. The BC Juvenile Turf Sprint was a race for the U.S.-based runners prior to last year. Wesley Ward is the exception. He is known for sending some of his better early season juveniles to Ascot in the spring, and he did just that with two of his winners (Twilight Gleaming, Golden Pal). It almost seems impossible that there were 24 pre-entries in this race and none are trained by Ward.

Last 3 Winners: Overseas invader Mischief Magic (IRE) won the BC Juvenile Turf Sprint race in 2022 for Charles Appleby and Godolphin. It was Twilight Gleaming in 2021 and Golden Pal in 2020, and both were Ortiz Jr./Ward.

BC Juvenile Turf Sprint Horse Comments:

#1 Crimson Advocate (4-1) was a clear third behind Brightwork in her dirt sprint bow. She added blinkers and graduated in a turf sprint stakes second time out, and shipped to Ascot and won the 26-horse G2 Queen Mary by a nose. Relief Rally was the runner-up that day and she won her last two starts including the G2 Lowther at York Aug. 24. She is fast early for George Weaver and is one of the top contenders in this race.

#2 No Nay Mets (4-1) is a talented turf sprinter for George Weaver. He cruised from start to finish in his winning turf sprint stakes debut. He went to Ascot and finished 9th of 14 in the G2 Norfolk second time out. He returned to the states and wired the field in the Tyro July 30, and the 2-3 finishers were next-out winners. He easily scored again as the chalk in the Rosie's at Colonial Downs Sept. 9, and the show finisher was a next-out stakes winner. He drilled a turf bullet for this on the Saratoga training turf Oct. 20. Irad Ortiz Jr. hops aboard the filly for the first time.

#3 Tiger Belle (15-1) is 3-for-5 with a runner-up finish and all five races were at 5T. Two wins were in Ireland, and she shipped to France and captured a G3 Aug. 31, and runner-up Dawn Charger won the G3 Prix Eclipse Sept. 16 and was 2nd in the G2 Criterium de Maisons Laffitte Oct. 7. She is one of the more interesting overseas shippers.

#4 Big Evs (3-1) won a Group 3 race in GB in August. He was nowhere in his next Group 1 start, and bounced back with a Group 2 score at Doncaster Sept. 15. His overseas turf sprint form is not bad, and if an invader fires in this spot, he might be the one.

#5 Givemethebeatboys (15-1) was an early bloomer in Ireland with back-to-back turf sprint wins in May including a G3 score at the Curragh. He was 4th, 3rd, and 4th in his last three turf sprint stakes starts and others seem more appealing.

#6 Starlust (20-1) misfired in his bow, was part of the exacta in his next five starts (3 wins), and was 5th of 9 at 22-1 in a G1 at Newmarket last time. The G3 winner is probably not good enough to win but Dettori should give him every chance to succeed.

#7 Shards (15-1) ran well in all four starts. He broke his maiden in a turf sprint at Colonial Downs Sept. 7 and was a close 3rd in the Indian Summer last time. He is getting better.

#8 Cherry Blossom (12-1) had it going on in July and August with a win and a pair of runner-up finishes. She placed in a Group 2 Aug. 24 and exits an okay 4th of 11 in the G1 Cheveley Park at Newmarket. She probably wants a bit more real estate to work with.

#9 Amidst Waves (8-1) fired in all four turf sprints. She graduated second time out and won the Colleen and

Bolton Landing in her next two starts. She rallied to miss by a nose in the Indian Summer last time. She was the favorite in her last three starts and continues to get faster.

#10 Valiant Force (12-1) was 2nd in his bow and finished 5th behind Givemethebeatboys (IRE) second time out. He picked up a stunning win at 150-1 in the G2 Norfolk, and was 5th of 9 in the G1 Prix Mornay Aug. 20. He must prove that his lone win was for real.

#11 Slider (8-1) is faster on dirt. He set the pace and was clearly second best in his bow, and chased from second and pulled clear in a fast dirt sprint second time out. He switched to turf and won the Speakeasy as the favorite Oct. 7 but his speed rating dipped. I would like him more if this was the Juvenile Dirt Sprint.

#12 Committee of One (8-1) was my top choice over Amidst Waves in the Indian Summer and he got up by a nose at 7-1. Asmussen's Mendelssohn colt is getting faster but he might run out of ground at this abbreviated trip.

AE #13 Hedwig (20-1) stalked and scored over Committee of One in his 5.5T bow and the show finisher was a next-out winner. He chased from 2nd, led, and was second best as the beaten favorite in a turf sprint stakes at KD last time. Rispoli will ride if he gets in.

AE #14 Asean (20-1) needs two defections to get in and this would be his first start beyond 5T. He is also entered in Friday's Golden Mile at SA (see race 1).

AE #15 April Vintage (20-1) would be hung out in a tough post if she made in into the field. She graduated at 5T Sept. 1 and was 3rd in the Speakeasy last time.

Trends: The Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies has been held at Santa Anita ten times (see chart below). Brave Raj was the first winner at the Great Race Place in 1986. Phone Chatter (1993), Halfbridled (2003), Stardom Bound (2008), She Be Wild (2009), Beholder (2012), Ria Antonia (2013), Take Charge Brandi (2014), Champagne Room (2016), and British Idiom (2019) also won this race at Santa Anita Park. The Oak Leaf shows up three times, and that Santa Anita race has been renamed the Chandelier. Five of the ten winners had their final prep at Santa Anita including champion Beholder, dam of 2023 BC Juvenile Fillies favorite Tamara. Early speed can be dangerous in this

race, and watch out for horses exiting a good effort in the Frizette.

Last 3 Winners: Wonder Wheel rallied from the back of the pack to win this race in 2022 for Tyler Gaffalione and Mark Casse. She paid \$15 and was exiting a front running victory in the Grade 1 Alcibiades. Echo Zulu did not disappoint as the chalk in the 2021 renewal of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies for Steve Asmussen. She was 3-for-3 heading into this event including back-to-back Grade 1 wins in the Spinaway and Frizette. Vequist was the 2020 winner at Keeneland and she was first in the Spinaway (G1) and second in the Frizette (G1) prior to the Breeders' Cup.

Jockeys to Watch: Javier Castellano guided home two winners at Santa Anita (British Idiom, Ria Antonia). Joel Rosario has booted home the winner of this race in three of the last five years (Echo Zulu, Jaywalk, Vequist). Mike Smith rode the winner of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies three times (Caledonia Road, Songbird, Stardom Bound). John Velazquez piloted a pair of winners in this race (Caressing, Storm Flag Flying).

Trainers to Watch: Steve Asmussen saddled My Miss Aurelia to victory in 2011, and he struck again with Echo Zulu in 2021. Bob Baffert has surprisingly only won this race twice (Indian Blessing, Silverbulletday). D. Wayne Lukas is still very much active in this game, and he saddled the winner of this race a record six times including Take Charge Brandi at Santa Anita in 2014. Richard Mandella saddled the winner of this race three times at Santa Anita (Beholder, Halfbridled, Phone Chatter), and he has morning line favorite Tamara in 2023.

BC Juvenile Fillies Horse Comments:

#1 Candied (4-1) was a professional winner from off the pace in her 6f bow at the Spa. She stretched out in the G1 Alcibiades second time out and ran down experienced stakes winner V V's Dream to win by a length. Pletcher's Candy Ride filly should save ground behind the speed and is a logical top three candidate.

#2 Jody's Pride (15-1) aired by 10 lengths in a race originally scheduled for turf and run at 5.5f on a good track in her SAR bow Aug. 9. She ran in the Matron Stakes second time out and that race was also moved to dirt, and she stalked and scored by 3 1/4 lengths. She earned a better speed rating last time but her trainer struggles with his graded stakes starters.

#3 Scalable (20-1) is still a maiden for Pletcher. She split a 10-horse field from the outside post in her bow and was a solid 2nd in the G2 Chandelier last time. That Chandelier

had multiple maidens signed on and this is a much deeper cast.

#4 Where's My Ring (30-1) is still a maiden after three starts. She stalked, led, and missed by a nose in her 5.5f bow, and stalked, led, and finished a close 3rd on a good track at 6.5f second time out. She was 4th of 9 in the G3 Surfer Girl at 8T last time. She needs an easier spot.

#5 Omaha Girl (30-1) is a \$400k Omaha Beach filly with a 2-for-3 record. She is 2-for-2 on dirt and exits a front running stakes win in the Hallandale Beach at one mile. She is not nearly fast enough.

#6 Chatalas (8-1) stalked outside and gamely graduated by a half-length in her 5.5f bow at DMR. She chased the pace and was no match for Tamara in the G1 Del Mar Debutante second time out, and stretched out and wired the field from the inside post as my top choice in the G2 Chandelier last time. I thought that last race was weak but she did flatter Tamara.

#7 Tamara (4-5) is going to win this if she handles two turns. She stalked and scored from the intimidating inside post in her 6.5f bow at DMR, and sailed away from her rivals in a 6 3/4 length tally in the G1 Del Mar Debutante. They purposely kept her out of the G2 Chandelier so she would be fresher for this. Her dam Beholder won this race, jockey Mike Smith has three wins, and trainer Richard Mandella has three BC Juvenile Fillies wins at SA including Beholder.

#8 *Espirit Enchante* (20-1) spilt a 10-horse field in her bow and winner *Sandy Bottom* scored again in the *Anoakia* Oct. 21. This \$250k *Tapit* filly stalked and graduated by a nose at 6.5f on a good local track Oct. 1. She drilled a 6f bullet for this Oct. 21 and has potential, but not in this race.

#9 *Brightwork* (12-1) was zipping right along in dirt sprints earlier this year. She is 4-for-4 sprinting on dirt including wins in the *Debutante*, *Adirondack* (G3), and *Spinaway* (G1). She failed to handle two turns in a fading 5th of 8 in the *Alcibiades* last time. She appears best around one turn.

#10 *Accommodate Eva* (20-1) added blinkers and jumped up with a vastly improved effort in an extended sprint maiden win Oct. 12. The pace was slow that day and she had control of the race throughout. This two turn G1 will have much livelier fractions but I will use her underneath at long odds.

#11 *Life Talk* (20-1) is a \$335k *Gun Runner* filly for *Pletcher*. *Alys Beach* beat her by a head in her bow and she returned to romp at one mile as the strong favorite second time out. She ended up an okay 3rd in the G1 *Frizette* last time and should handle two turns.

#12 *Just F Y I* (8-1) is interesting for *Bill Mott*. The 6f distance was probably too short for her in her bow but she stalked and scored by a head. She competed in the G1 *Frizette* in the slop at one mile October. 7, and she stalked and was clearly best by 3 3/4 lengths. Her pedigree

screams two turns (Justify - Star Act, by Street Cry) and her best races should be in front of her. She might win this if Tamara stubs her toe.

#13 Alys Beach (30-1) stalked the pace and beat Life Talk by a head in her dirt sprint bow at Saratoga. She was outrun early and passed a few rivals in the G1 Spinaway Sept. 3, and Brightwork and Ways and Means dominated that race. She set the pace from the inside post and just held the show in the G1 Alcibiades last time. She is not fast enough.

Justify won that race. Horses exiting a prep in this country captured this race 9 times. Three overseas runners scored including Meditate (IRE) last year, and Woodbine shippers tallied three times. It looks like Newmarket is the main racecourse to look for when considering overseas runners.

Last 3 Winners: Last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf winner Meditate (IRE) rallied from 10th place to win this race by 2 1/2 lengths as the favorite for Ryan Moore and Aidan O'Brien. Miss Grillo (G2) winner Pleasant Passage was second best and Woodbine shipper Cairo Consort picked up the show at 19-1. 2021 Juvenile Fillies Turf winner Pizza Bianca was exiting a runner-up finish in the Natalma (G1) at Woodbine. Jessamine (G2) winner Aunt Pearl won this event at Keeneland in 2020 for Brad Cox and Florent Geroux.

Jockeys to Watch: Three riders have won this race twice (Javier Castellano, Florent Geroux, Irada Ortiz Jr).

Trainers to Watch: Chad Brown has had tremendous success in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. Maram (2008), Lady Eli (2014), New Money Honey (2016), and Newspaperofrecord (2018) pulled off the Miss Grillo/BC Juvenile Fillies Turf double for Brown, who also saddled

Rushing Fall to victory in this race in 2017 at Del Mar. The latter did not prep in the Miss Grillo. She exited a win in the Jessamine at Keeneland.

BC Juvenile Fillies Turf Horse Comments:

#1 Buttercream Babe (30-1) was solid in all three turf sprints. She battled on the pace and won by 1 3/4 lengths in her 6.5T bow, and closed, led, and held 3rd in the Untapable second time out. She missed by a neck in the G3 Surfer Girl last time and the slow pace and slow race helped her cause. She might impact the pace.

#2 Flattery (20-1) rallied from off the pace to win her first two 8T starts including the Juvenile Fillies Turf at DMR Sept. 9. She was an even 3rd in the local G3 Surfer Girl Oct. 8 and her number dropped that day. I like this filly but not in this race.

#3 Buchu (6-1) is improving rapidly for Phil Bauer. She stalked and smartly graduated at 8.5T Sept. 23 and earned a quality late pace rating. That was her fourth career starts, and she proved that one was for real when she clicked in the G2 Jessamine at KEE Oct. 6. She won her last two turf starts at this distance by a combined 8 1/2 lengths and the Justify filly can be competitive in this spot.

#4 Laulne (15-1) is an overseas transplant now conditioned by D'Amato. She fired in all six turf sprints in France. She won a G3 at 7T in July and hit the board in her last two starts vs. G2 and G3 company including a neck defeat Sept. 16. They paid \$793k for this one in 2023

and she is bred to handle this distance.

#5 Content (15-1) exits a decent G3 win at the Curragh for Aidan O'Brien and she was 20-1 in that 10-horse 8T affair. The daughter of Galileo has the look of a filly on the improve.

#6 Porta Fortuna (5-1) might be a contender in this spot for Donnacha O'Brien. She is 4-for-6 with two minor awards. She won a pair of G3 races earlier this year and exits a victory in the G1 Cheveley Park at 6T Sept. 30. Can she handle the added ground of this race?

#7 Gala Brand (12-1) made up an amazing 14 lengths in the final furlong and a half in her winning 5.5T bow and runner-up Hidden Class was a next-out winner. She stretched out and beat the boys in the G3 With Anticipation Aug. 31 and runner-up Carson's Run won the G1 Summer in his next start. Bill Mott's filly was the favorite in the G2 Miss Grillo Oct. 4 and she ran 4th in a race that did to set up for her. She packs a nice late kick and can be played in this race.

#8 Life's an Audible (15-1) switched to turf and graduated at 5 1/2 furlongs second time out, and stretched out and was 2nd in the G2 Miss Grillo last time. She needs to continue to improve if she expects to threaten these.

#9 Carla's Way (6-1) won her 6.5T bow in GB at 5-2 odds and the runner-up was a next out winner. She was 8th of 17 in the G3 Albany second time out and Porta Fortuna handled her in that race. She was 2nd in a G2 at 7T Aug.

26. Darnation won the latter race and scored again in the G2 May Hill Sept. 14. This filly exits a 7T score vs. G2 rivals at Newmarket. She beat Ylang Ylang (GB) last time and that one returned to capture the G1 Fillies Mile at Newmarket Oct. 13. The \$437k Starspangledbanner filly has good company lines.

#10 Austere (12-1) won both turf routes for Brendan Walsh. She stalked and scored from post 11 in her 8.5T bow at Ellis Park, and stalked and kicked away in a \$500k 8T stakes at KD last time. She will need to run much faster to threaten these.

#11 She Feels Pretty (4-1) rallied to win her 5.5T bow by a neck July 16. She was flying late in that race, and she stretched out and rolled home to a 4 1/4 length victory in the G1 Natalma at 8T second time out. Natalma runner-up Simply in Front returned to graduate in an all-weather route Oct. 7. Cherie DeVaux is a sharp trainer and I consider this filly a contender.

#12 Hard to Justify (6-1) sat in midpack and came running for the win at 3-1 odds in the turf route bow. She was 7-1 in the G2 Miss Grillo last time and sat outside in 2nd and won by a measured half-length. Watch out for Chad Brown's Miss Grillo winners in the BC Juvenile Fillies Turf. They are usually live.

#13 Dreamfyre (15-1) was too fleet for her rivals in back-to-back dirt sprint stakes wins to begin her career. She was blitzing through 21 and change fractions in those races, and she stretched out and switched to turf in the

Surfer Girl (G3) last time. She was the favorite there but I was not sure about the added ground or surface switch, but she battled though slow fractions and gamely prevailed by a neck in a slow race. She should be forwardly placed.

#14 Les Pavots (8-1) finished in the top three in all six starts in France. She won a G2 at 7T on heavy ground Aug. 19 and was 3rd of 10 in a flat mile G1 at Longchamp Oct. 1. She will have to overcome a tough post and must prove that she can handle firm footing.

AE #15 Go With Gusto (15-1) rallied from post 10 to cross the line 1st in her 8T bow at WO but was placed 5th through disqualification. She was along for the show in the G1 Summer second time out and runner-up My Boy Prince was a next-out stakes winner in the Cup and Saucer. Mark Casse's Medaglia d'Oro maiden will try to get involved from off the pace.

AE #16 Mo Fox Given (30-1) stalked the pace and pulled off a 49-1 upset in her turf route bow at Colonial. She rallied from last to miss by a head at CD second time out. Powell has her now and she will try to get involved late. She improved her number last time but she seems overmatched.

Trends: This event has been held at Santa Anita ten times (see chart below). Capote was the first winner at the Great Race Place in 1986. Brocco (1993), Action This Day (2003), Midshipman (2008), Vale of York (2009), Shanghai Bobby (2012), New Year's Day (2013), Texas Red (2014), Classic Empire (2016), and Storm the Court (2019) also won this race at Santa Anita Park. Four of the SA winners exited the Norfolk, FrontRunner, and American Pharoah, and they are all the same race at Santa Anita Park. It was run as the Norfolk from 1970-2011. They changed the name to FrontRunner from 2012-2017, and it started running as the American Pharoah Stakes in 2018. Horses with two turn experience captured the Breeders' Cup Juvenile in 9 of the last 10 years. 2013-16 BC Juvenile heroes, plus 2018-22 winners all had two turn experience, and eight of those winners scored in two turn races prior to the BC. Good Magic was the lone recent exception. He was a maiden with two starts heading into the BC, and was exiting a runner-up finish in the Champagne (G1), a one-turn mile.

Last 3 Winners: Forte won this race last year at 5-1 odds while stalking the pace from midpack. He was exiting a win in the Breeders' Futurity (G1), so he pulled off a Grade 1 double at Keeneland. 2021 BC Juvenile hero Corniche won his first two starts including the American Pharoah (G1) at Santa Anita. Essential Quality also pulled off the Breeders' Futurity/BC Juvenile double at Keeneland in 2020.

Jockeys to Watch: The only active rider with more than one BC Juvenile win is Mike Smith. He booted home the winner of this race three times (Unbridled's Song, Vindication, Corniche).

Trainers to Watch: Bob Baffert and D. Wayne Lukas both saddled the winner of the BC Juvenile five times. Todd Pletcher won the BC Juvenile with Uncle Mo (2010), Shanghai Bobby (2012), and Forte (2022). Doug O'Neill saddled two winners (Stevie Wonderboy, Nyquist).

BC Juvenile Horse Comments:

#1 The Wine Steward (8-1) is a NY-bred son of BC Classic winner Vino Rosso. He stalked and scored in his first three sprints and two of those were stakes races. He worked out a nice stalking trip from the inside post in the Breeders' Futurity, but Locked was better despite covering much more ground. I do not have anything bad to say about this \$340k purchase, but he is probably a cut below the top contenders. Another inside stalking trip would help his cause.

#2 Prince of Monaco (4-1) has done nothing wrong for Baffert. The \$950k Speightstown colt dueled early and won for fun in his LRC bow. He sat behind strong fractions and went right on by his stablemate Muth in the Best Pal (G3), and he clicked right back in the Del Mar Futurity (G1). Most of the recent winners of this race had two turn experience so he has that to overcome, but he is clearly talented enough to win this.

#3 Wine Me Up (15-1) is a \$300k son of Vino Rosso and he is fast early. He dueled inside and won his debut by 1 1/2 lengths. He stretched out in the American Pharoah and set the pace and was no match for his stablemate Muth in a clear runner-up finish. He should impact the pace in this race.

#4 Timberlake (4-1) is one of the Big 4 Grade 1 winners. The \$340k Into Mischief colt broke slow and flopped as the chalk in his bow and that was a productive race. He added blinkers and crushed a pair of next-out winners second time out. I made him my top choice in the Hopeful (G1), and the pace was strong and he was running up on

heels, and he had to settle for the place behind shocking late runner Nutella Fella. He was almost 5-1 in the Champagne (G1) Oct. 7, and he removed blinkers, rated behind the pace, and pulled well clear to score by 4 1/4 lengths in the slop. He has yet to go two turns but sure acts like he will handle added ground.

#5 Ecoro Neo (30-1) - SCRATCHED.

#6 Locked (7-2) is one of the more likely winners of this race. He showed nice late interest after an uncomfortable start in his sprint bow. He got more ground and a better start at 8f Sept. 1, and he pressed the pace and dusted next-out winner Drum Roll Please. In the Breeders' Futurity (G1) Oct. 7, he raced wide throughout from the outside post and gamely wore down inside stalker The Wine Steward. Pletcher won this race in 2022 with Breeders' Futurity hero Forte.

#7 Cuban Thunder (30-1) was sharp in overseas turf sprints in April and May. He went off form after that and has lost his last four starts by a combined 63 1/4 lengths.

#8 General Partner (8-1) made an easy lead and cruised second time out. He was able to set the pace in the Champagne after Fierceness blew the break, and he was clearly second best behind Timberlake. I do not see him getting an easy lead this time.

Which #9 Fierceness (6-1) will show up? Will it be the romping debut version or the up the track Champagne runner? Was that the same horse last time? He was

outstanding in his bow and that was a productive race, and he lunged at the start and was nowhere last out. He needs an alert beginning and a clear early lead, but Wine Me Up wants the front end as well.

#10 Muth (4-1) is a \$2 million Good Magic colt and his sire won the BC Juvenile in 2017. He romped in his sprint bow and was too eager chasing strong fractions second time out. He stretched out in the American Pharaoh (G1) and everyone was wondering if he could ration his 21 and change speed. The answer was a resounding yes. He stalked kindly from an inner post, took over, and kicked away from his front running stablemate Wine Me Up. He could easily become Baffert's sixth winner of this race.

#11 Noted (20-1) ran well in all four starts. He graduated in a turf route and switched to dirt and won the Sapling. He was back on turf for the Bourbon (G2) last time, and he rallied late to miss by a nose. He is a decent sort but is not fast enough to win this race.

Trends: This is still a relatively new BC event (first held in 2007). The Juvenile Turf has been run at Santa Anita seven times (see chart below). At SA, the winner of this

race prepped overseas five times, and the other two SA winners were exiting victories in the Pilgrim. Overseas runners have won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf 11 times in 16 years. 2014 winner Hootenanny started his career in this country, but his final two preps before the Juvenile Turf were at Ascot and Deauville, so I am counting him as an overseas winner. The Pilgrim Stakes in New York is a key race for the U.S. runners. Fire At Will, Structor, Oscar Performance each pulled off the Pilgrim/BC Juvenile Turf double.

Last 3 Winners: Last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Victoria Road (IRE) sat in midpack and nipped post time favorite Silver Knott (GB) by a nose. Ryan Moore rode the winner for Aidan O'Brien and he paid \$13.14. Nagirroc landed the show at 39-1 and Mo Stash was fourth at 51-1, and those two runners blew up the superfecta. Modern Games (IRE) took this event in 2021. He was mistakenly scratched due to a gate snafu and was reinstated by the stewards, but he ran for purse money only. William Buick guided him home for Charles Appleby. Pilgrim winners Fire At Will (2020) and Structor (2019) both captured the BC Juvenile Turf for the U.S. team.

Jockeys to Watch: Ryan Moore booted home the BC Juvenile Turf winner five times (Wrote, George Vancouver, Hit It a Bomb, Mendelssohn, Victoria Road). Frankie Dettori pulled off the hat trick in this race, and William Buick and Jose Ortiz both won this event twice.

Trainers to Watch: Aidan O'Brien has won this race five times and Ryan Moore was aboard each of those winners. Charles Appleby struck in 2013, 2018, and 2021 (Outstrip, Line of Duty, Modern Games), and William Buick rode the latter pair. John Gosden saddled the winner of this race in 2008 and 2009 at Santa Anita, and Frankie Dettori rode both.

BC Juvenile Turf Horse Comments:

#1 Air Recruit (20-1) stalked and scored in his 5.5T bow, and was 3rd behind No Nay Mets in the Rosie's at 5.5T second time out. He stretched out and cruised in the Laurel Futurity last time. He is not fast enough to threaten these.

#2 River Taber (3-1) brings consistent overseas turf sprint form to the table for Aidan O'Brien. He won his first three starts including the G2 Coventry, and was 3rd in his last two G1 starts. He is not out of this if he handles the added ground of this race, and O'Brien's main rider Ryan Moore opted for this one.

#3 Tok Tok (20-1) won his first two turf starts at Colonial including the Kitten's Joy. He tried tougher company in the

G2 Bourbon and ended up 5th of 12. Motion's colt earned okay late pace ratings in his last two starts.

#4 Can Group (12-1) completed the trifecta in his first two dirt sprints and Timberlake beat him second time out. He switched to turf and graduated at 7T Sept. 2 and stretched out and went last-to-first in the 12-horse G2 Bourbon at 27-1 odds Oct. 8. He is getting faster and earned a strong late pace rating last time. I can see him landing a share in this spot.

#5 My Boy Prince (8-1) finished 1-2 in all five starts for Mark Casse. He set the pace in his last four starts and comfortably won three of those races. He was 2nd in the G1 Summer and dominated restricted stakes foes in the Cup and Saucer last time. He should impact the pace and might be the main speed.

#6 Stay Hot (20-1) switched to turf and stretched out after two dirt sprints, and he looked sharp in his local 8T maiden win Oct. 7. I think there is something here but he is not ready for this type of company.

#7 Agate Road (8-1) packs a nice late kick for Pletcher. He flew late to miss by a nose in a race originally scheduled for turf and run at one mile on dirt at SAR Aug. 5. He got no pack help and closed powerfully to graduate at 8.5T second time out. The \$650k Quality Road colt finished full of run to win the G2 Pilgrim Oct. 4 and that race has proven to be a strong prep for the BC Juvenile Turf. His number dipped last time and I am not sure he is fast enough to win this.

#8 Unquestionable (4-1) might be the right one for Aidan O'Brien. He was competitive in all five starts but only scored once. His victory was a sharp 6T score May 27 and he missed by a head in a G2 July 2. He missed 3rd by a head in a G1 at 6T Aug. 12, and showed improvement in a runner-up finish in a G1 at 7T Oct. 1. Dettori rides this one.

#9 Endlessly (5-1) won all three flat mile turf starts from off the pace. He captured the G3 Del Mar Juvenile Turf Sept. 10 and took the G3 Zuma Beach at SA Oct. 8. He improved his speed ratings in all three starts and can make some noise in the lane.

#10 Fulmineo (20-1) hooked subsequent G1 Hopeful hero Nutella Fella in his dirt sprint bow, and stretched out and graduated in a turf route second time out. He was along for the place in the G2 Pilgrim last time, and Agate Road is the one I want out of that race.

#11 Liam's Journey - SCRATCHED.

#12 Mountain Bear (12-1) was 3rd in a G2 Aug. 1. He is 2-for-7 overall and exits an all-weather extended sprint win in a 14-horse field Oct. 6. Aidan O'Brien has some better runners in this race but he is not completely out of this.

#13 Grand Mo the First (20-1) won his first two all-weather sprints at GP. He shipped to SA and finished an okay 3rd in G3 Zuma Beach last time. The Uncle Mo colt is over his head in this spot.

#14 Carson's Run (6-1) rallied to earn his diploma by a neck over next-out winner Moonlight in his turf route bow at SAR. He stalked and finished a half-length behind Gala Brand in the G3 With Anticipation, and he strongly went last-to-first in the G1 Summer last time. Christophe Clement's colt has some ability but the post is tough.

Comments: **#2 Ghost of Midnight** (4-1) might be the value play. He was excellent from off the pace in his winning \$20k maiden claiming bow at DMR and the clear runner-up was a next-out winner. He stalked and spurred away to win by 7 3/4 lengths second time out. He was 8-1 in his bow and 6-1 second time out, and he earned a much better number last time. He reunites with his debut pilot Fresu and he might be this good. **#3 Hejazi** (7-5) makes his much anticipated return for Baffert. He was 3rd as a maiden in the G1 American Pharoah last year and wired the field in a local MSW sprint Jan. 15. He set the pace and weakened to 4th in the G2 San Felipe, and stalked, battled for the win, and ended up 2nd by a length when last seen in the Lafayette at KEE in the spring. Baffert and company paid more than \$3 million for this Bernardini colt and his new rider Hernandez wins races with this outfit. **#4 Bus Buzz** (9-5) is a fleet CA-bred Stay Thirsty gelding. He fired exacta shots in all six dirt sprints and the real Good Deal winner should be all over the

pace.

For Rolling Doubles and Pick 3 tickets, key the top choice in each race to all other contenders. See examples below:

Double (Race 1-2):

- Ticket 1 (5-7)
- Ticket 2 (5/5-6-7-11)
- Ticket 3 (4-5-6-8/7)

Double (Races 2-3):

- Ticket 1 (7-4)
- Ticket 2 (7/2-3-4-6-12-13)
- Ticket 3 (5-6-7-11/4)

Pick 3 (Race 1-3):

- Ticket 1 (5-7-4)

Ticket 2 (5/5-6-7-11/2-3-4-6-12-13)

Ticket 3 (4-5-6-8/7/2-3-4-6-12-13)

Ticket 4 (4-5-6-8/5-6-7-11/4)
